



Chaplain Felty knocked spiritual emphasis week out of the park with daily speakers and bands. Dr. Tung and the academics team is pushing hard with





UPDATE ON RENOVATIONS AND FACILITY UPKEEP

The cadets are enjoying their new room furniture and freshly renovated bathrooms that were recently completed thanks to the generosity of special Hargrave donors.

The bathroom facilities have undergone a total transformation, with work being completed down to the studs. The renovation included new flooring and replacement of the underlying wood, pan liners throughout, properly installed drains and new tile and fixtures. These bathrooms were in critical need of repair due to a lack of adequate drainage, which resulted in water damage and ongoing related issues.

This renovation, along with the new furniture in each room and new flooring in the hallways, has transformed the barracks for the Corps. Thank you to the donors who made this possible and to the construction teams and Hargrave's maintenance staff for their exceptional work.







Character Trait Awards

During this school year, Hargrave Military Academy selected core values and traits to focus on each month. This program supports Hargrave's Character Across the Campus Program and serves as another tool to reinforce values that are important to Hargrave's mission of building young men into leaders of character prepared for lifelong success.

Additionally, faculty and staff were able to recognize cadets on the spot who demonstrated exceptional character with an Excellence in Character Impact Award, a card that the cadet may redeem for a free pizza at the snack bar.

Cadets could also earn the Excellence in Character Award, designed to recognize one deserving cadet every four weeks who clearly exhibits the highlighted character trait of the month. The deserving cadet was recognized at a chapel service with a certificate and a President's challenge coin.

Students, staff and faculty could also submit poems every 3-4 weeks through Google forms that are based on the highlighted character trait. The poems were judged by the English department and the winners of the award may be published in Hargrave's literary magazine.

FALL SPORTS



SOCCER

The varsity soccer team had another successful campaign in 2019. They finished with an overall record of 3-12-3, but that record does not tell the whole story. Playing one of the most challenging schedules our program has ever faced, the Tigers battled every contest and had single-goal defeats against top-five ranked teams on multiple occasions. For his stellar play this season, Daniel Pierce was selected to all-conference teams.



CROSS COUNTRY

Cross country traveled across the state of Virginia to run challenging courses all season, and it paid off in a big way down the stretch. Mason Schrage and Wesley Marquardt paced the Tigers this season, who finished 9th in the VIC Conference Meet. Marquardt earned second team all-metro recognition this past October. Our Tigers showed vast improvement as the season endured, led by Jay Thompson and Bennett Soles.

FOOTBALL

The Tigers experienced an up and down season under firstyear head coach, Jeff Schaum, but positive light was shed this season as Hargrave defeated rival Fishburne in dramatic fashion, 21-16, in mid-October. Corey Farmer, Jr. was a standout performer for the Tigers this season, as he earned second team all-state as an offensive lineman and was first team allconference as an offensive and defensive lineman. The Tigers also had multiple all-conference awardees: Nick Hammock (second team, wide receiver), Mason Rucker (second team, offensive lineman), Darius Hankins (second team, defensive back), Peyton Johnson (second team, linebacker).



WINTER SPORTS

RIFLE

The rifle team finished the season with 13 dedicated and motivated shooters. Over the season, our top four shooters emerged, to include Eli Benjamin, Barney Li, Dongjun Ma and Bojong Yang. Despite falling in their final match, this group of young men worked tirelessly and showed great improvement throughout the season under the tutelage of SGM Scott Dooley.



VARSITY BASKETBALL

Playing in one of the top conferences in the nation for high school basketball, the Tigers had another banner year, earning a 22-7 overall record. The Tigers faced a staggering 21 games against top ranked opponents this season, and racked up notable wins against Miller School (three times), Eastern Mennonite, Virginia Episcopal School, Atlantic Shores and North Cross. Despite their difficult schedule, the Tigers boasted win streaks of nine games and two five-game winning streaks. The Tigers also made it to the championship of the 64th Annual Sleepy Thompson Basketball Tournament, won the VIC Division 1 Conference Championship and reached their fourth consecutive VISAA Division 2 State Tournament Elite Eight.





PG BASKETBALL

PG basketball entered postseason play with a 33-3 record, and is currently ranked #4 in the country. Notable wins include Oak Hill Academy (exhibition), Huntington Prep, Woodstock Academy and The Skills Factory to name a few. The Tigers recently took home the First Piedmont Corp. Invitational title. The team features players that are being recruited by SEC, ACC and Big 10 schools, led by Georgia signee K.D. Johnson (Atlanta, GA) and Tennessee signee Corey Walker, Jr. (Hastings, FL). The Tigers were a top seed in the National Championship in Connecticut and made it to the final four!

SWIMMING

Hargrave saw swimmers drop time throughout the season, and combined with some strong second-semester additions, the Tigers narrowly missed winning the conference championship, finishing as the runner-up. Nathan Higdon broke a 17-year-old school record in the 100 Yard Breaststroke with a time of 1:01.59. The Tigers sent eight swimmers to the VISAA State Championship Meet with Higdon and freshman Andrew Bolz leading the way. The team had an outstanding result at the state meet, finishing third in VISAA Division II.



WRESTLING

With blood, sweat and tears left on the mat all season, the young Tigers showed vast improvements throughout the winter months. During the annual Cody Day Invitational, the Tigers earned multiple first-place finishes, led by Samuel Lee, who earned December athlete of the month. Elias Hanson, Sebastian Richardson and Mason Rucker all had strong individual seasons as well.

Alumni Spotlight: David Fitzgerald `70

David Fitzgerald was the Battalion Commander of Hargrave's class of 1970. He graduated from the University of Richmond and retired after more than a 30-year career in law enforcement in the Henrico County, VA. Upon retirement, David and his wife founded and operated Homestead Traditionals, a business and way of life preserving the past. They raised and processed livestock and fruit and vegetables, as well as numerous colonies of honeybees naturally without chemicals. They maintained a coal-fired blacksmith shop and a candle making and broom making shop - all in keeping with Appalachian folkcraft traditions. They retired again several years ago and now reside on the bank of the Chesapeake Bay. They enjoy fishing, reading and spending time with their nine grandkids.

What did it mean to you to be the Battalion Commander?

Even after 50 years, I vividly recall the personal satisfaction and pride immediately after the announcement that afternoon. I further recall the honor that descended upon me shortly thereafter when Academy staff members from the President on down described the responsibility they expected me to accept and fulfill. I remember thinking, "what have I gotten into?" All I really wanted to do was keep my grades up and graduate, freeing me from Hargrave. After fulfilling this obligation with the extraordinary team effort of each and every one of my classmates, then as today, I realize you never simply leave Hargrave. Your experiences there will define the rest of your life by providing that foundation so often spoken of in the literature.

What did you learn during your time at Hargrave?

The foundation Hargrave allowed me to build my life on was not mandated to conform to any specific blueprint, but simply gave me a list of materials I could use in my individual construction. I learned and knew that a successful foundation at Hargrave would require strength and growth of character, teamwork, commitment, acceptance of responsibility and the resulting consequences of all my actions, hardwork and, above all, a dedication and commitment to the Christian faith in all that I did. I also learned failure was a part of the process of living a life based on your foundation and when it happened, to accept it and its consequences. Also, to examine your foundation to make sure you have not allowed it to shift.

What is your favorite memory from Hargrave?

It would have to be the genuine atmosphere surrounding the entire Hargrave community - the safe environment in which to grow and learn as an individual and member of a community there solely to encourage, support, protect and pick you back up. You saw and understood this in the classroom, dining hall, barber shop, etc. This is what Hargave was and still is. One never forgets this atmosphere and feeling.

What advice would you give to upcoming Cadets?

The class of 1970 donated a statue that stands in front of the Hargrave Chapel. On a plaque on this statue of a Hargrave cadet are the words of then Hargrave President Joseph Cosby, "I came a boy, here I became a man." I would encourage each cadet as they pass this statue to occasionally evaluate where they stand on this continuum between the boy they were and the man they want to be, and use the wonderful environment of Hargrave tradition to accomplish their goals.





HARGRAVE LISTED AS STATE AND National Historic Landmark

The Virginia Board of Historic Resources approved Hargrave Military Academy as one of eight new listings in the Virginia Landmarks Register during their meeting on Sept. 19, 2019.

According to the Department of Historic Resources, the new listings are in the counties of Albemarle, Hanover, Loudoun, New Kent, Pittsylvania and Pulaski; and the cites of Fredericksburg and Richmond.

The National Park Service, a division of the U.S. Department of Interior, added Hargrave to the National Register on January 24, 2020. This is a wonderful honorary designation and these honorary designations can only be achieved by meeting the high criteria set for the registers!

Excerpt from the Virginia Board of Historic Places:

Hargrave Military Academy evolved from Chatham Training School, a private, males-only parochial school, into a military-focused educational institution by the outset of World War I.

Hargrave is representative of the advent during the late-19th and early-20th century of private preparatory schools in Virginia as well as trends in military education through the 20th century.

The academy's campus is distinguished by a noteworthy collection of early- to mid-20th century Colonial Revival-style buildings designed by prominent Virginia architects including Stanhope S. Johnson and Nyal Lee Cline. Hargrave commissioned Johnson to design new buildings after a 1950 fire burned several early ones.

Hargrave's commitment to the Colonial Revival style throughout the 20th century resulted in an architecturally cohesive campus with buildings that range from the high-style, ornate representations of the early-20th century movement to the stripped classical examples that became popular in the post-World War II period.



Remembering Former Hargrave President COL Thomas Cunningham

Thomas "Tom" Cunningham, 77, died November 27, 2019, surrounded by his family, after a long courageous battle with cancer. Tom was born in Hattiesburg, MS in 1942 to Walter and Helen Cunningham. They moved soon after his birth to Steubenville, OH where Tom and his siblings were raised. Tom especially enjoyed his time playing football for Steubenville Big Red High School.

Tom received an appointment to West Point, the United States Military Academy, following high school and made lifelong friends while he was a cadet there. Reunions with fellow West Point football players were a favorite experience each year up until his death.

He graduated from West Point in 1964 and began an illustrious 26year career in the military. During his career, he received a Master of Science in geophysics from the University of Pittsburgh. He also

served as an instructor at West Point and then returned years later as the Director of Operations of the Academy. He later held the role of Commandant of the United States Military Academy Preparatory School.

After retiring as a colonel from the Army, Tom served as President of Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, VA from 1990-1997, and then worked as a training consultant for a few years in the textile industry. Later, he was chief of Protocol at Fort Bragg until he took his final job at the Chamber of Commerce in Wilmington, NC, where he and his wife, Mary Jane, finally settled into retirement.

Tom is survived by his high school sweetheart and wife of 55 years, Mary Jane (Arthurs) Cunningham; son, Patrick (Becky) Cunningham of Clayton, NC; daughter, Kerry (Shawn) Fitzgerald of Wilmington, NC; son, Daniel Cunningham of Riegelwood, NC; son Michael (Cheryl) Cunningham '93 of Charlotte, NC; sister, Patricia (Joe) McDaniel of Danville, KY; sister-in-law, Sheri Arthurs of Wilmington, NC; 11 loving grandchildren; and a host of dear nieces, nephews, in-laws, and longtime friends around the country.

Tom was a man of great character and integrity. He was well respected and loved by most anyone who crossed his path. His life was an honorable expression of his love for Jesus, his devotion to his wife and children and service to his country.

On Sunday, January 19, 2020, Harry Gladding '54 passed away. Harry worked most of his life in the insurance business and helped grow his agency from having three employees to 22 employees. He attended the Hartford Insurance School in Hartford, CT.
