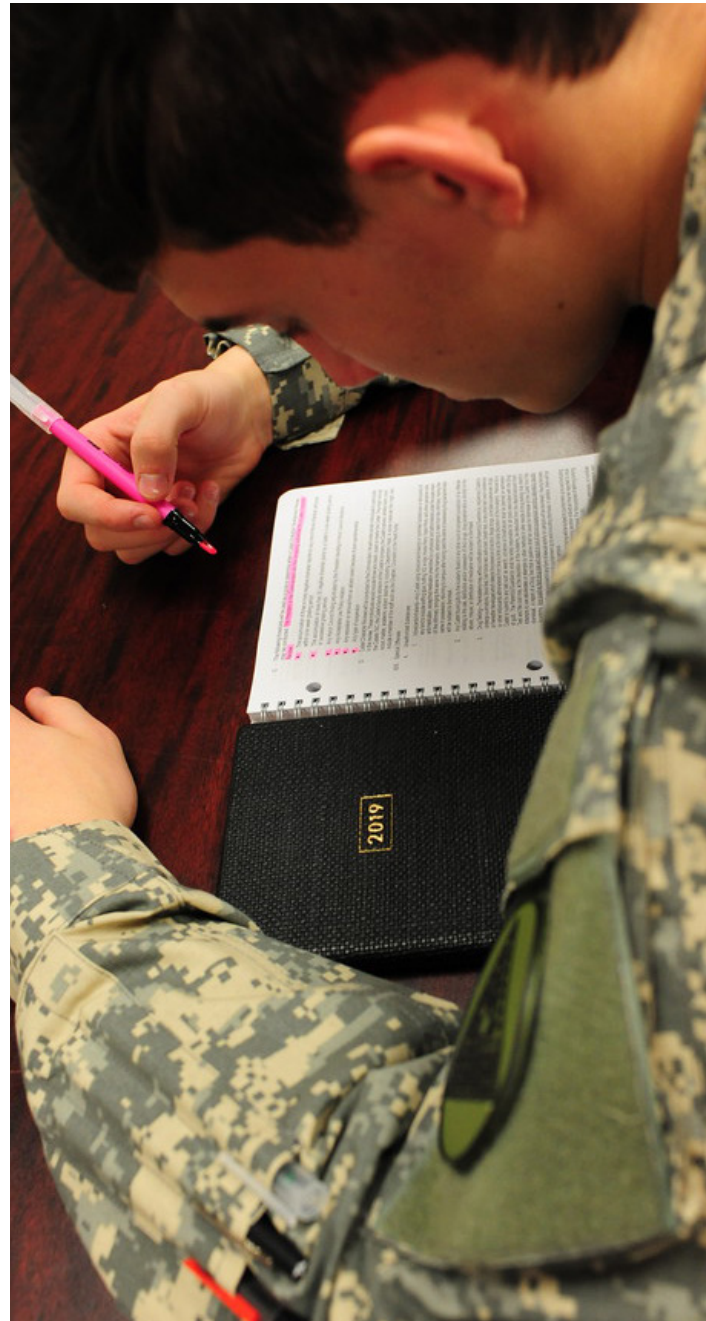

Unfortunately, there was a handful of demotions due to first semester grades and conduct. Cadet officers are required to have a 2.5 GPA for selection and maintain a 2.0 GPA. The good news is that these young men have the opportunity to earn their rank back by bringing their grades back to a 2.0 GPA.

The Hargrave Military Ball was held Saturday, March 2. It has a historical context with a promenade and is a wonderful opportunity for the Corps of Cadets (10th grade through Post Graduates) to celebrate with brother Cadets and young ladies from hometowns and sister schools. # Trunk of Truth

The Trunk of Truth is a blending of the old and new - a repurposing of what was removed due to age and disease. The trunk started as one of two beautiful maple trees planted in front of Camden Hall. Unfortunately, one became diseased and died, presenting both an eyesore and a safety concern. Several Cadets assisted a staff member as he took the tree down, top to bottom. The Hargrave President came out to assist, joining the Cadets in the dragging of limbs and branches. During the work, the question arose "what are we doing with the trunk?" One Cadet piped up and said, "We should put Honor Council violators on it as part of their accountability." This idea was batted around amongst the President and Cadets, while the intrepid staff member continued lowering the tree. One Cadet opined, "We should call it the Trunk of Truth. If you are found guilty of lying, you stand on the trunk in place of Bull Ring tours." The name stuck, a mark was made to identify the desired remaining stump height and policies were developed to implement using the Trunk of Truth.

The Trunk of Truth can be awarded to any Cadet being found guilty of an honor violation. If awarded, the Cadet will stand on the Trunk of Truth in full parade uniform at either the position of attention or parade rest. One tour on the Trunk of Truth is equivalent to two tours on the Bull Ring. Cadets are given the option of the trunk or the tour, offering the offending Cadet a choice in his punishment, yet still providing accountability.

Honor Council tours used to be in the front of the Camden Administration Building or the Cosby Building, but today's traffic volume presents a large risk to those Cadets. The Trunk of Truth provides a visible reminder to the Corps of Cadets of the importance Hargrave Military Academy places on the Honor Pledge, without endangering them.

Once the Trunk of Truth dries out, Honor Council plans to paint it black with an orange top and the word "truth" stenciled on the side.

# FALL SPORTS



## SOCCKER

The varsity soccer team had another successful campaign in 2018. They finished with an overall record of 7-10-2, but that record does not tell the whole story. Playing one of the most challenging schedules our program has ever faced, the Tigers battled every contest and had losses by only one goal against top-five ranked teams on three separate occasions. The Tigers won the annual Hargrave Soccer Classic in dramatic fashion, winning the championship by virtue of a penalty shootout in front of a large crowd at Simpson Parade Field. For their efforts, both Chad Demarest and Gabe Powers were selected to all-conference teams.

## CROSS COUNTRY

Cross country traveled across the state of Virginia to run challenging courses all season, and it paid off in a big way down the stretch. Gabe Medlin emerged as a star for the Tigers, placing fourth at the VIC Championship and 17th at the state championship, finishing as the sixth fastest underclassman in Virginia. Tyler Morris, Hamza Al Tell and Rashed Khraisat cut times all year and all earned top 100 finishes at the state championship meet as well.





## FOOTBALL

After a slow start to the season marked by key injuries, the Tigers roared back and caught fire in the season's final five weeks. After an 0-4 start, Hargrave won four out of five games to close the year, scoring 38 points or more in each contest. The hot streak earned the Tigers a top-ten ranking in the state as they narrowly missed a playoff berth. Wade Thomas dazzled crowds all season and was selected as a first team all-conference running back, a second team all-conference defensive back and a second team kick returner. Adam Saliu and Justin Campbell both earned all-conference and all-state honors as wide receivers, while Nyjuan Pritchett (first team linebacker), Brian Williams (first team safety) and Jasuan Murrell (second team defensive lineman) also collected accolades.



# WINTER SPORTS



## RIFLE

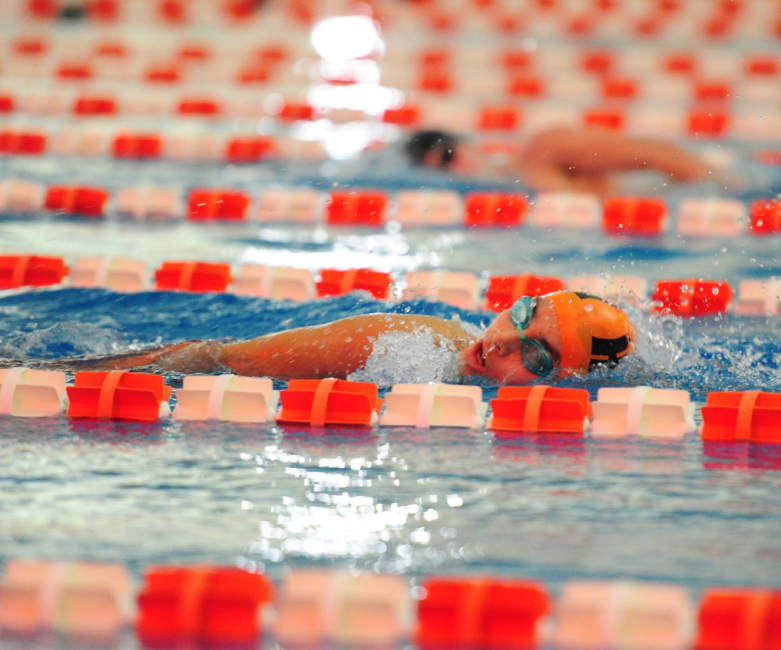
The rifle team entered their state championship match on a high, earning their first win in dramatic fashion, topping Fishburne 956-950. Chandler Wilkie continued his strong shooting from last season, pacing the Tigers in every match. David Kiesnowski shot a personal best in the big win over Fishburne, and the Tigers also got personal bests from Biago Pugliese and Jacob Kitchen on that day.

## PG BASKETBALL

PG basketball entered post-season play with a 33-2 record, and is currently ranked No. 4 in the country. Their 33 wins include eight over top-10 nationally ranked opponents, notably two against arch rival Fork Union by an average of 23 points, and a 37-point victory over No. 6 ranked Mt. Zion. This season, the Tigers also achieved something remarkable - they won their 100th straight home game at Walter Davis Gymnasium! The last time they suffered a defeat at home was over five years ago. The team features players that are being recruited by SEC, ACC and Big 10 schools, led by Middle Tennessee State signee Tyson Jackson (6'9"/Atlanta, GA), Navy signee Tyler Nelson (6'5"/Charlotte, NC) and Tennessee signee Davonte Gaines (6'8"/Buffalo, NY). The Tigers figure to be a top seed in the upcoming national championship in Connecticut and will be looking to make a run at winning another title!

## SWIMMING

Hargrave saw swimmers drop time throughout the season, and combined with some strong second-semester additions, narrowly missed winning the conference championship, finishing as the runner-up. Maurizio Visconti headed up the newly-revived diving program, and won first place at the VIC meet, which earned him a spot at the VISAA State Championship meet. Sophomore Nathan Higdon emerged as a breakout swimmer for the Tigers, qualifying for the state championship in seven events. Overall, the Tigers medaled in eight of the 12 VIC Championship events, and qualified eight different swimmers for the state meet.

## WRESTLING

With blood, sweat and tears left on the mat all season, the Tigers peaked at the right time and were able to bring home the VIC Championship in front of their home crowd at Walter Davis Gymnasium. The Tigers had standout performances up and down the roster that day, including Tyler Medlin (Gold Medal), Gabe Medlin (Bronze Medal), Elias Hanson (Gold Medal), Deven Wallace (Silver Medal), Tyler Morris (Bronze Medal), Quinn Griffith (Gold Medal), Walter Thompson (Silver Medal) and Max Hohimer (Bronze Medal), who all earned a spot on the podium in their respective weight classes. At the state championships, Max Hohimer made a run for the ages, but fell just short of the medal stand, finishing in fifth place. Sebastian Richardson (seventh place), Deven Wallace (eighth place) and Tyler Morris (eighth place) each earned all-state honors at the meet as well.



## VARSITY BASKETBALL

Playing in one of the top conferences in the nation for high school basketball, the Tigers had an outstanding season. The Tigers faced a staggering 16 games against top-10 ranked opponents this season, and racked up notable wins against Virginia Episcopal School on the road (ranked No. 2 in the state), Highland School (No. 5) and Norfolk Collegiate (No. 7) along the way. They also scored big wins over traditional foes North Cross, Fishburne, Carlisle and Westover to clinch another winning season. The Tigers made a run to their third straight VISAA D2 Elite Eight, before falling to VES 40-39. The Tigers finished with a 13-12 record, and were ranked No. 7 in the final VISAA polls.

# CHANDLER WILKIE:

## MEET HARGRAVE'S CLASS OF 2019 BATTALION COMMANDER



### **What does it mean to you to be the Battalion Commander?**

**CW:** For me, being the Battalion Commander is about becoming the successful Cadet that Hargrave admissions wants to brag about to future Hargrave families. Despite whatever your personal feelings about the school may be, as Battalion Commander it is your job above all to be the ideal image of what a Hargrave Cadet should be at all times. **CW:** One of the important things I have learned from my time at Hargrave is the ability to prioritize. Once you accept the fact that you don't always have enough hours in the day to get everything done and that you don't have to burn yourself out, you can focus on what really matters.

### **What advice would you give to upcoming Cadets?**

**CW:** As a new Cadet, the best thing you can do is stay quiet, learn how Hargrave works and learn about the people around you before you start trying to make friends. Be cautious of who you choose to hang out and talk with, when you still don't know anyone very well.

### **What are your plans for after graduation?**

**CW:** This really depends on whether or not I am accepted into the Air Force Academy, but as of today I am planning on attending NC State University on a four-year Army ROTC scholarship.

# *Four Generations at Hargrave: A 100-Year Legacy*

For some Cadets, attending Hargrave Military Academy is in their blood. Hargrave junior David Kiesnowski, a fourth-generation Cadet, is a prime example. His mother, Meredith Kiesnowski, graduated in 1988, his uncle, R. Overton Harper, III, graduated in 1996, his grandfather, Richard O. Harper, Jr., attended Hargrave for summer sessions, his grandmother, Diane Harper, is a former teacher and trustee, and his great-grandfather, R. Overton Harper, graduated in 1921.

The Harper family has resided in Pittsylvania County for over 150 years. Overton Harper attended Hargrave, along with several of his brothers. Meredith states that her grandfather and Mr. Hargrave were good friends and there has been a family connection with the Academy for 100 years. Overton always looked forward to attending Hargrave's annual homecoming and did so even when he was wheelchair bound after suffering a stroke.

Meredith chose to attend Hargrave for the many opportunities it provided. Although she excelled during her years as a Tiger, she was pleasantly surprised that attending Hargrave would have a big impact on her future.

"When I applied for graduate school at MCV (Medical College of Virginia), I was accepted without an interview. When I asked the director why I was not interviewed, I was told he knew that as a Hargrave graduate, I would have the leadership skills necessary to be successful in healthcare administration," said Meredith.

Meredith chose to send her son, David, to Hargrave because she knew first hand that he would have opportunities not available to him in their Wisconsin community. At Hargrave, David has studied the Arabic language under former instructor Danielle Barr. Under her advisement, he was encouraged to apply for a critical languages scholarship for eight weeks of intense study in Amman, Jordan. The scholarship is funded by the U.S. Department of State and is very competitive. Over 3,000 students apply for the scholarship annually, and David was one of only 20 to be selected. David is the second Hargrave student to be awarded this prestigious scholarship. David's trip to Jordan gave him passion for a career path and as a result, David intends to study in Arabic at the university level to prepare for a career in the diplomatic corps or homeland security.

In addition to incredible opportunities, Hargrave is notorious for developing bonds that last a lifetime.

"I still feel like Hargrave is home to me. There were 25 young women at Hargrave when I was there. We all got along very well. We were great friends and many of us still keep in touch," said Meredith.

Looking at the future, the Kiesnowski family is very pleased with the current President and Commandant and they believe Hargrave is definitely headed in the right direction.

"Colonel Cosby's vision was to truly maintain independent status by not accepting government funding. Because Hargrave does not accept government funds, they are free to continue to support the core values of faith and patriotism upon which our nation was founded. His wisdom and forward thinking are why we have the Hargrave that we have today. Hargrave still has a focus on the fundamentals the school was founded upon and a leadership program second to none. If you don't set the bar high, you will never achieve excellence. The new leadership team has set the bar high and I have no doubt that they are the right people at the right time," said Meredith.

# Q & A with Conner Dooley



*Conner Dooley is an intern in the development office. During his time there, he also did research on Hargrave's history and has worked on finding more and preserving it. Last August, Col. Brown asked Mr. Dooley to find either the people or living descendants associated with the names on Hargrave's memorials, plaques and/or buildings.*

## **Why was this project started?**

**CD:** Col. Brown realized that we hadn't kept in contact with the families and individuals that were important enough to have something with their name on it here. He wanted to get in contact with them, if at all possible, to make them aware of the changes at Hargrave as well as the legacy that these individuals left behind. Therefore, I was tasked with researching these individuals and finding contact information for either them or their living descendants, which in some cases was three generations later.

## **How did you go about finding these individuals?**

**CD:** It was significantly easier if they were still alive! I could go into our alumni database and look up that person's current contact information. However, in most cases, the individual had more than likely passed and I had to go about finding that person's next of kin or the closest person to them. This involved trying to find an obituary for the person online. If that wasn't available, then I would call around to local libraries and newspapers of the deceased's last known address to see if they had their obituary archived. Most of the time both of them had it and would send it to me electronically. A few of the newspapers had me visit there in person to look because they only opened their archives at certain times. Using the names of relatives in the obituary, I called around using phone numbers and addresses found with an online search tool to confirm their information.

## **What were their reactions when you called?**

**CD:** They were really positive. The families were happy to find that Hargrave was creating this list and recognizing the individuals. Some of them had no idea that their family members had something named in honor of them here. One particular example that stands out is the story of Donald Reed Robertson '63. After graduating from Hargrave, he went to college, and later joined the Navy in 1966. During the Vietnam War, he was killed in action on March 26, 1969 while on a mission near the Cambodian border as a gunner's mate. To honor him, his fellow classmates had a plaque commissioned to be put in the infirmary ward where he helped as a medical officer. I found that he had a sister and contacted her. She was so overjoyed to hear about the plaque that was made for her brother that she donated \$500 to Hargrave!

**Are there any other stories that you would like to share?**

**CD:** A couple more come to mind. The founders of what would become Hargrave Military Academy: Jesse H. Hargrave, Thomas R. Sanford and Charles R. Warren, all have living descendants. While Mr. Hargrave did not have a biological child, he had an adopted daughter, Gladys Hargrave (later Nenon). Her great-grandson, Eric P. Nenon, attended Hargrave and graduated as Class of 1979. Additionally, I got in touch with a member of the Mabry family; she had no idea that her grandfather, Dr. Jesse H. Mabry, had a hall named after him. It's important that these individuals and facts were found because their family's history is a part of Hargrave's history.

**Do you have any advice for other aspiring researchers?**

**CD:** Always start with your primary sources first. Try to find someone that was around the time of the event you are researching. If it was too long ago, find any local newspapers or records from the area. Improve your communication skills. Not everything is on the Internet, and you'll more than likely have to call around for specific information and interview people that have historical knowledge. Make sure to contextualize history. Modern values can't be applied to historical norms, as there were different ideas at the time. Most importantly, be passionate about what you are researching. The investigative process can be frustrating at times, but the payoff is finding out an interesting fact or correcting a historical misconception. I think that is one of the most satisfying feelings in the world.

# Remembering Julian Russell "Russ" McCubbin



Russ McCubbin, Hargrave class of 1953, passed away on June 28, 2018.

During his time at Hargrave, McCubbin was captain of the football, basketball and track teams. He was all-state in track and football, and was voted "Athlete of the Year" in 1953. In addition to athletic accomplishments, McCubbin earned the highest grade in geometry, received straight A's in world history and was on the Honor Roll.

Upon graduating from Hargrave, he attended Virginia Tech on an athletic scholarship, where he majored in building construction.

McCubbin volunteered for the draft in 1954, and he served in the United States Army from 1954-1957 as both a security guard and a lifeguard. He strongly encouraged young men to fulfill their military obligation upon graduation from high school.

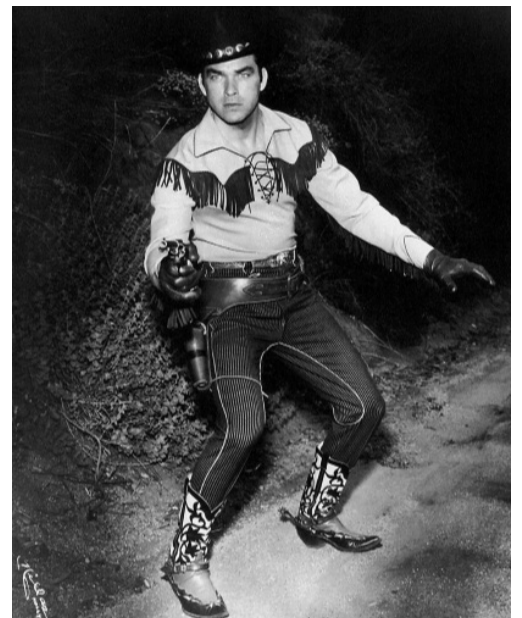
Instead of returning to Virginia Tech, McCubbin decided to hitchhike across the country in efforts to become an actor. In May of 1958, he arrived in Hollywood. He worked several odd jobs to support himself financially. He soon joined the Screen Extras Guild, doing walk-ons and extra work under several famous directors.

McCubbin appeared in numerous television shows, including Dukes of Hazzard; Guns of Paradise; Disney's World of Color; Divorce Court; Empire; Dennis the Menace; Daniel Boone; Superior Court; John Forsythe Show; Johnny Carson's Tonight Show; Double Life of Henry Phife; Magnum P.I.; Tarzan; Wild Wild West; Knight Rider; Gunsmoke; Wide Country; Cheyenne; Laredo; Bob Hope Show; The Dating Game; and Fantasy Island.

He also appeared in motion pictures, including Sudden Impact; Camelot; Cheaper to Keep Her; The Angry Breed; Million Dollar Duck; Waco; and in stage productions, including Send Me No Flowers; Bus Stop; A Spring to Remember; Tea and Sympathy; and Post Meridian.

Butler Boyd Brown (often referred to as Triple B or BBB), 35, of Morgantown, West Virginia, passed away suddenly on Saturday, October 6, 2018 at Ruby Memorial Hospital.

Butler was born on December 27, 1982 in Low Moor, Virginia, and was the son of Boyd and Deborah Ames Brown of Frankford, West Virginia. He was married to Letisha "Tish" Cole Brown and had one son Griffin Butler Brown (2 years old).

Butler always spoke about his HMA years with great affection. He attended alumni homecoming activities and continued HMA friendships throughout the rest of his life. While there, he enjoyed attending the military balls, participating in sporting events and traveling abroad to France.

Three possessions which Butler treasured were related to Hargrave. One of which, was the Bible he received from the HMA Alumni Association on his graduation day. His sister Sara, read from that Bible during her eulogy at his recent funeral service. The HMA captain chair was special to him with his name, school emblem and graduation year. 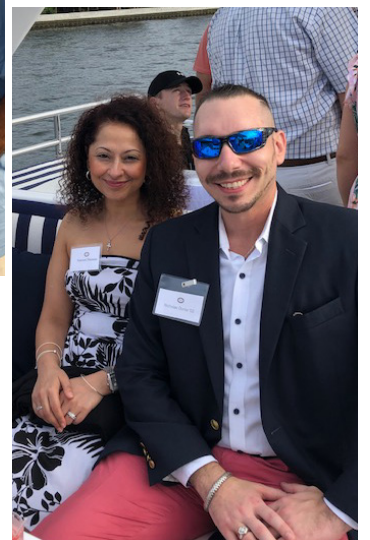
