The association, formerly known as the Headmasters Association, has continued to evolve over the years to meet the changing needs of its members. Today, it remains a vital resource for school leaders, providing opportunities for professional development, networking, and advocacy.

As the only organization of its kind, The Heads and Principals Association plays a crucial role in promoting excellence in secondary education and ensuring that all students have access to high-quality educational opportunities, regardless of their background or location.

Hargrave's President, Eric Peterson, was inducted into the Heads and Principals Association in 2010 after being nominated by a former teacher and colleague at St. George's School. The Association consists of 100 active members from 28 states and Washington, DC, as well as a number of other associate members. The Annual Conference takes place the first week of February and is held at the Washington Duke Inn in Durham, North Carolina.

The theme of this year's conference was "The Fabric of Democracy," with a host of speakers ranging from a Harvard Law professor to the Director of Triangle Center on Terrorism and Homeland Security. Of the Association, Peterson stated, "It is a great opportunity for leadership development and fellowship among heads. The speakers are impactful, and the informational seminars provide a uniquely valuable professional development opportunity."

TAKE FLIGHT AT HARGRAVE

Hargrave, in partnership with Averett University and their FAA-approved Part 141 flight school, welcomed the return of its flight program. Students participating in the Hargrave-Averett Aeronautics Partnership have the opportunity to complete Private Pilot Ground School and Flight 1, earning dual enrollment credits for each course.

Hargrave Academic Dean Jim Tung, who was instrumental in developing guidelines for student participation in the program, remarked, "The relaunch of the Hargrave flight program would not have been possible without the time and energy dedicated by Hargrave trustees Thomas Nichols and Averett President Dr. Tiffany M. Franks."

The Hargrave-Averett partnership gives students direct access to a career in aviation and allows Hargrave cadets to learn alongside Averett Aeronautics students. Averett's program offers classes for the following certifications: Private Pilot Certificate, Commercial Pilot Certificate, Flight Instructor Certificate, Flight Instructor Instrument Certificate, and Instrument Rating Certificate. Additional Aircraft Category or Class Rating Certificates and opportunities to earn an Airline Transport Pilot (ATP) Certificate with Reduced Aeronautical Experience are possible through Averett's collegiate and adult learning programs.

March 17 was Averett
University's Department
of Aeronautics' annual
Aviation Day. With hundreds
in attendance, Dr. Franks
introduced the crowd to
Nathanial Duff, the inaugural
cadet in the partnership
program. Duff is a senior at
Hargrave with an interest
in aeronautics. This fall, he
completed the coursework and
his first solo flight.


In keeping with an ageold tradition of the Averett Aeronautics program, Duff was presented with a special token to commemorate this accomplishment. When

decorated shirt.


Hargrave President Eric

Hargrave student pilots."




THE FINAL CHAPTER

Hargrave's 114th Commencement took place on Friday, May 19, 2023. Keeping with the decades-old tradition, the class of 2023 received 100% college acceptance. Of the twentynine graduates, two will attend United States Service Academies.















The 2022-2023 Varsity Basketball season at Hargrave was one for the ages as the Tigers rose to new heights in Alan Petty's third year with the program. Despite a challenging schedule, the Tigers performed admirably, amassing a 24-7 overall record, which goes down as the second-most victories in the modern era behind the 2016-2017 team that finished with 26 wins. In addition to winning 24 games, the Tigers finished tied atop the regular season standings with Blue Ridge in the Blue Ridge Athletic Conference and ultimately finished as runners-up in the 2023 BRAC Conference Tournament.

Coach Petty's squad achieved something that has never been done in the VISAA (Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association) era by advancing to the VISAA Division 2 State Basketball Tournament Final Four! Standout performances included Dante Kearse (Team MVP; 1st Team All-VISAA) and Timayahs Bracey (1st Team All-VISAA), as well as a balanced cast of players such as Bobby Hardison '24, Troy Giles '23, Tyson Mobley '23, and Alex Turner '24.

Previously, Hargrave had advanced to the VISAA Division 2 State
Basketball Tournament Elite Eight six times, including four straight trips between 2016-2017 and 2019-2020, but failed to advance to the Final Four until this past season.
The 2022-2023 campaign was such a special season for the Tigers as they earned the #2 ranking in the state polls heading into postseason play, the highest ranking the Academy has achieved in the VISAA era!

A SEASON OF ACCOLADES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Hargrave Postgraduate Basketball program wrapped up their 2022-23 campaign with a 44-2 overall record, including titles in the Fork Union Christmas Tournament, the First Piedmont Corp. Invitational, the Elite Prep League (Regular Season and Tournament) along with impressive single game victories such as the January 16th defeat of Fork Union inside historic Cameron Indoor Stadium (Duke University) and the January 17th win over the University of North Carolina's JV team inside the famous Dean E. Smith Center.

Due to the Tigers' success this season, the national media took another opportunity to laud them for their accomplishments on the court and the sideline this past season!

Next Up Recruits, who provided outstanding coverage for the 2022-23 postgraduate basketball landscape, recently announced their All-American teams as well as the National Coach of the Year.

Hargrave's storied Postgraduate Basketball program found itself squarely in the spotlight again as numerous players garnered All-American nods and Head Coach, Thomas Messinger, took home the hardware as the National Coach of the Year!

Messinger helped this already illustrious program soar to new heights in his third year at the helm. Messinger sits with a winning percentage of .934 and an overall record of 114-8 over the past three seasons.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR DEPARTS HARGRAVE

The 2022-23 Next Up Recruits National Postgraduate Coach of the Year is heading to the collegiate ranks, as Thomas Messinger has accepted a position at the New Jersey Institute of Technology, also known as NJIT (an NCAA Division 1 program located in Newark, New Jersey) as an Assistant Men's Basketball Coach.

Messinger has served as the Head Postgraduate Basketball Coach and Basketball Program Director at Hargrave since the summer of 2020 and recently completed his outstanding tenure at the helm. Prior to Messinger's three seasons as Head Postgraduate Basketball Coach, he served as the Associate Head Postgraduate Basketball Coach under Lee Martin (2017-2020), who is currently an Assistant Men's Basketball Coach at Ohio University. Messinger also worked as an Assistant Postgraduate Basketball Coach



under the tutelage of A.W. Hamilton (2015-2017), the current Head Men's Basketball Coach at Eastern Kentucky University.

"I've been blessed to be surrounded by great players, great coaches, great mentors, and great administrators throughout my time at Hargrave. Every bit of success we have had as a program is a direct reflection of many people's hard work, both in the spotlight and behind the scenes. I will be forever grateful for the incredible support, mentorship, and friendship of Lee Martin, A.W. Hamilton, and Kevin Keatts, who laid a foundation of success that is unparalleled in the basketball world. I am also overwhelmingly thankful to the board of trustees, Ben Davenport, COL Mike Brown, Sloan Gibson, and Eric Peterson, for entrusting me with the program. I'm humbled and beyond proud to have been a part of the history at Hargrave." Messinger commented.







VESHI NAMED PG BASKETBALL HEAD COACH

Ben Veshi was officially introduced as the Head Coach of the Hargrave Postgraduate Basketball team on Wednesday, May 24th. Veshi will also assume the role of Program Director, overseeing the Varsity, Junior Varsity, and Middle School teams in addition to his duties as the Postgraduate Basketball Head Coach. Veshi takes over for Thomas Messinger, who recently accepted a position as an Assistant Men's Basketball Coach at NJIT. Veshi served as the Associate Head Postgraduate Basketball Coach during the 2022-2023 season after a two-year coaching hiatus as he transitioned into a role within Hargrave's Senior Administration. He also spent time as an Assistant Postgraduate Basketball Coach on the staffs of Lee Martin (2017-2020), the current Assistant Men's Basketball Coach at Ohio University, and A.W. Hamilton (2016-2017), who is now the Head Men's Basketball Coach at Eastern Kentucky University.

Veshi's time with the postgraduate team has been a stretch of unfathomable success. Serving under Messinger, Martin, and Hamilton, his teams have achieved an overall record





of 200-16, highlighted by two Final Four appearances (2017, 2020) and an Elite Eight appearance (2019). Hargrave has reached the National Tournament every year that Veshi has served on staff. All told Veshi has helped 67 players and counting continue their careers at the Division 1 level in his five years with the program. Veshi was also part of the Hargrave team that set school records for points scored in a single game (173; 2019).

In his four seasons as Head Coach of the Varsity Basketball Team, he established a modern-era school record for wins in a season (26) and earned four straight berths to the VISAA Elite Eight en route to an overall 75-32 record (.701 winning percentage). In addition, Veshi was honored with Hargrave's O.B. Teague '42 Coach the Year Award after the 2018-2019 season. During his four years with the Varsity Basketball program, Veshi developed and coached 23 collegiate players, including eight at the Division 1 level. Veshi has also served as Director of Athletics (2020-2023), where he obtained a Master's of Sport Administration from Arkansas State University, and College Counselor (2017-2022) in addition to his roles within the basketball program.

"I am humbled and honored to be named the Head Postgraduate Basketball Coach at Hargrave. I first have to thank Mr. Eric Peterson, Mr. and Mrs. Davenport, and the Board of Trustees for giving me the opportunity to lead our program. Hargrave has been the gold standard of prep school basketball for the last 30+ years, not only because of the tremendous success achieved on the court but also

Before arriving at Hargrave, Veshi earned a Master's of Business Administration in Marketing from Nichols College in Dudley, Massachusetts, while serving as an Assistant Men's Basketball Coach at his alma mater, Catawba College, an NCAA Division 2 institution located in Salisbury, North Carolina, from 2014-2016. Prior to coaching at Catawba, Veshi broke into the coaching profession

as an Assistant Boys' Varsity Basketball Coach and Assistant Girls' Varsity Basketball Coach at Marianapolis Prep in Thompson, Connecticut, where Veshi attended high school. Veshi graduated from Catawba in 2013 with a Bachelor of Science in Sport Management with a minor in Business Administration and was a member of the Men's Basketball team as a walk-on under the leadership of legendary head coach Jim Baker. While at Catawba, Veshi was a member of the 2009-10 SAC Regular Season Championship Team and earned a berth in the NCAA Division 2 Men's Basketball Tournament. Prior to Catawba, Veshi, a Webster, Massachusetts native, spent four years at Marianapolis Prep under the coaching leadership of Dave and Andrew Vitale and took part in incredible levels of success, including a NEPSAC Class D Championship as a freshman and three straight NEPSAC Class B Runner Up finishes during his sophomore, junior, and senior years.


BUILDING A BROTHERHOOD

This year's Eye of the Tiger Challenge began on Saturday, March 4, 2023. Eye of the Tiger is a 27-hour-long challenge that consists of multiple events, including a physical fitness test, a combat fitness test, team-building exercises, an obstacle course, a 5km hike, an "escape and evade" challenge, a Keep in Memory Skills Test, and a written cadet test. At the end of the challenge, cadets who pass the minimum standards for the required number of events receive their Eye of the Tiger patch and crest.

Notably, this year, most candidates participating were younger than in previous years, and a Postgraduate elected to participate for the first time. Sixteen cadets received the "Official Tiger" title, and not a single participant chose to quit. We commend their efforts and success in the face of this grueling challenge.

Hargrave forges new relationships and welcomes the local community to reach out and schedule time for their young athletes to work with our dedicated coaching staff in the new state-of-the-art facility. The Rick Cline Baseball Center is critical to the Hargrave baseball program as it will help with year-round skill development, training, and community outreach.
